ANDY MURRAY must decide by tomorrow if he wants to compete at the Australian Open. His mum, Judy, revealed Murray came out of coronavirus isolation only **YESTERDAY** following his positive test.

His management team spoke overnight to tournament director **Craig Tiley** about the logistics of getting to Melbourne at the 11th hour.

If **Muzza** (right) intends to play in Melbourne, he has to arrive in the country no later than Sunday.

Australian law states players must quarantine for two weeks in a designated hotel.

There is also the complication that if someone tests positive for the virus on his flight, he would have to undergo hard quarantining.

That would mean no training or outdoor exercise before the Slam starts on February 8.

Open stars told: Don't serve mice

TENNIS aces are being told not to feed **MICE** in their hotel rooms — in the latest twist of the Aussie Open's quarantine chaos.

World No28 **Yulia Putintseva** was forced to change rooms after spotting a mouse.

And she then took to social media to document more of the rodents.

Victoria state police minister **Lisa Neville** encouraged players to "minimise interaction" with mice.

She added: "As I understand, there may have been some feeding going on."

Putintseva is one of 72 tennis players self-isolating for 14 days in hotel rooms after positive Covid tests on their flights.

The Kazakh tweeted: "It's actually a lot of them (mice), not one in my room now! Different room, same story — wanted to go to sleep but nooooope!"

Putintseva also hit out at a lack of fresh air in the hotel.

Three more people associated with the event tested positive yesterday, to bring the total to ten.

Novak Djokovic (inset) rejected claims players are selfish for complaining. The world No1 — in much better conditions 450 miles away in Adelaide — said: "It is difficult to be a mere onlooker knowing how much every help, gesture and good word mattered when I was small and insignificant in the world pecking order."

SIX NATIONS COUNTDOWN

JACK JONES!

England chief forced to isolate



ENGLAND boss **Eddie Jones** is in quarantine as a **Covid crisis** hampers their **Six Nations** preparations.

Australian Jones (left), 60, has been forced to self-isolate until a week today, meaning he will be missing for his team's first training session next week.

The chaos started after forwards coach **Matt Proudfoot** tested positive for coronavirus on Monday.

And boss Jones, as well as backs coach **Simon Amor**, were both close contacts of the South African and have to complete at least ten days in quarantine.

That means Jones' No2 **John Mitchell** is the only frontline coach with the experience to

lead face-to-face training ahead of their Six Nations opener against Scotland at Twickenham a fortnight on Saturday.

An England statement said: "Coach **Matt Proudfoot** has tested positive for Covid-19 and is self-isolating. He is not displaying any symptoms."

"Head coach **Eddie Jones** and **Simon Amor** have been identified as contacts and will also isolate for ten days."

"England players will meet at St George's Park on Wednesday, January 27."

"Following further negative tests, Jones and Amor will join up with the group the next day."

Jones will name his squad as planned tomorrow but players have also been hit hard by the pandemic.

Bath's England contingent, that includes **Sam Underhill**, **Anthony Watson**, **Will Stuart**, **Jonathan Joseph** and **Charlie Ewels**, are

also in isolation after their training ground was shut.

And if their Premiership game against Bristol a week tomorrow gets cancelled, that is bad news for **Kyle Sinckler**.

His two-week ban for swearing at a referee rules him out of that and the Scotland clash, but could then roll over into the Six Nations match with Italy.

Holders England's campaign is due to conclude against Ireland at the Aviva Stadium on March 20.

Meanwhile, Jones has replaced skills coach **Jason Ryles**, who opted to stay in Australia because of the pandemic.

Ed Robinson, 27, son of former England and Scotland boss **Andy**, joins the staff from Championship side **Jersey Reds**.

Jones added: "We're looking forward to welcoming **Ed** for the tournament. He's a talented young coach."

"We support **Jason's** decision and expect him back with us this summer."

Wayne: It's not child's play

WALES head coach **Wayne Pivac** has admitted that the **Six Nations** is no place for kids.

Pivac looked at youth in the Autumn Cup but is under pressure for wins in the upcoming championship after a horror first year in charge.

After recalling veteran flanker **Dan Lydiate**, 33, he said: "In the Six Nations we're going to need experience. We didn't per-

form as well as we would have liked in the last tournament and we know now it's about results.

"We've selected a squad we believe will give us the chance to improve performances week in, week out."

"We're here to win the tournament and we put that pressure on ourselves. We're in the here and now."
